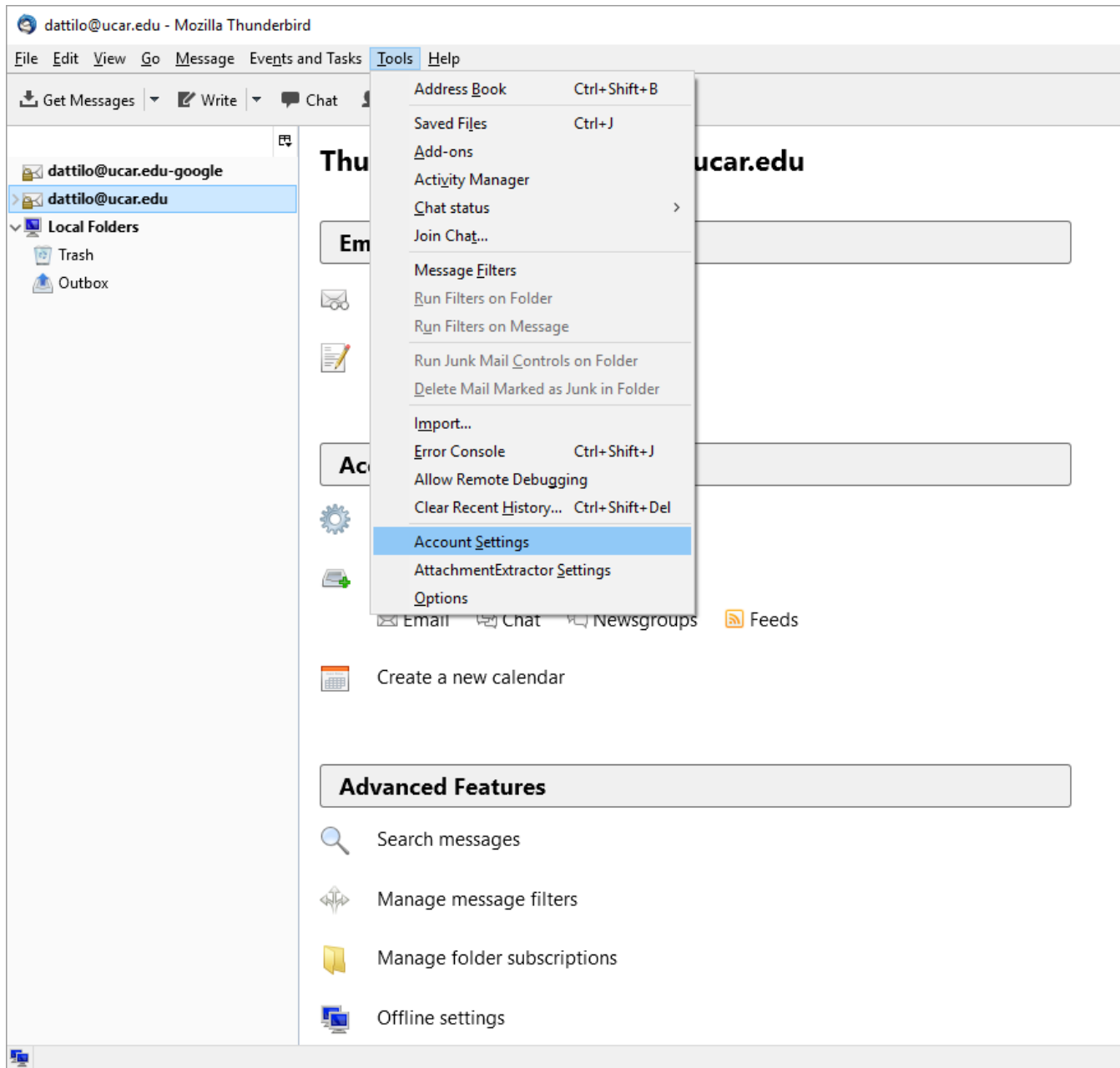
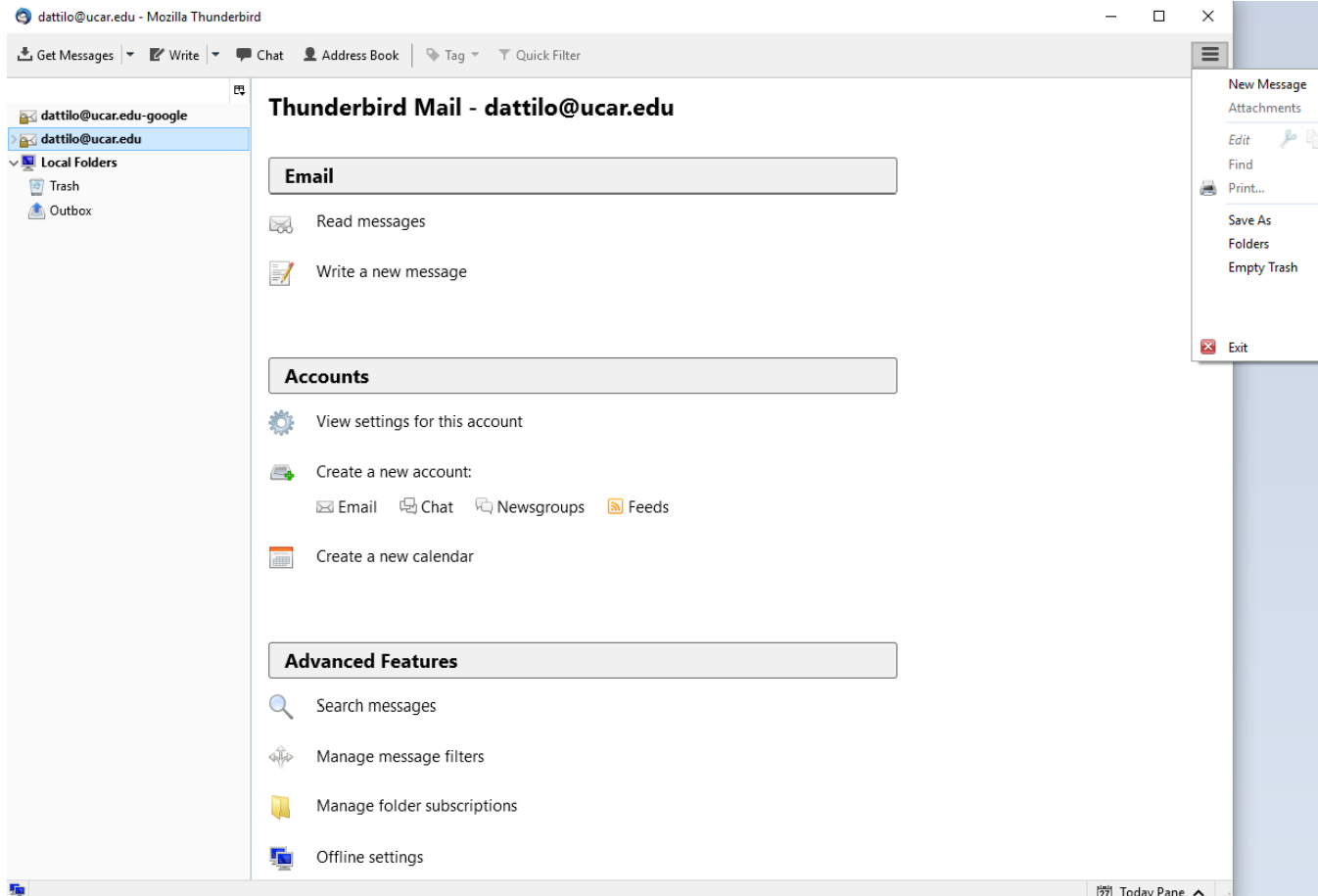


Setting Up OATH2 for Thunderbird:

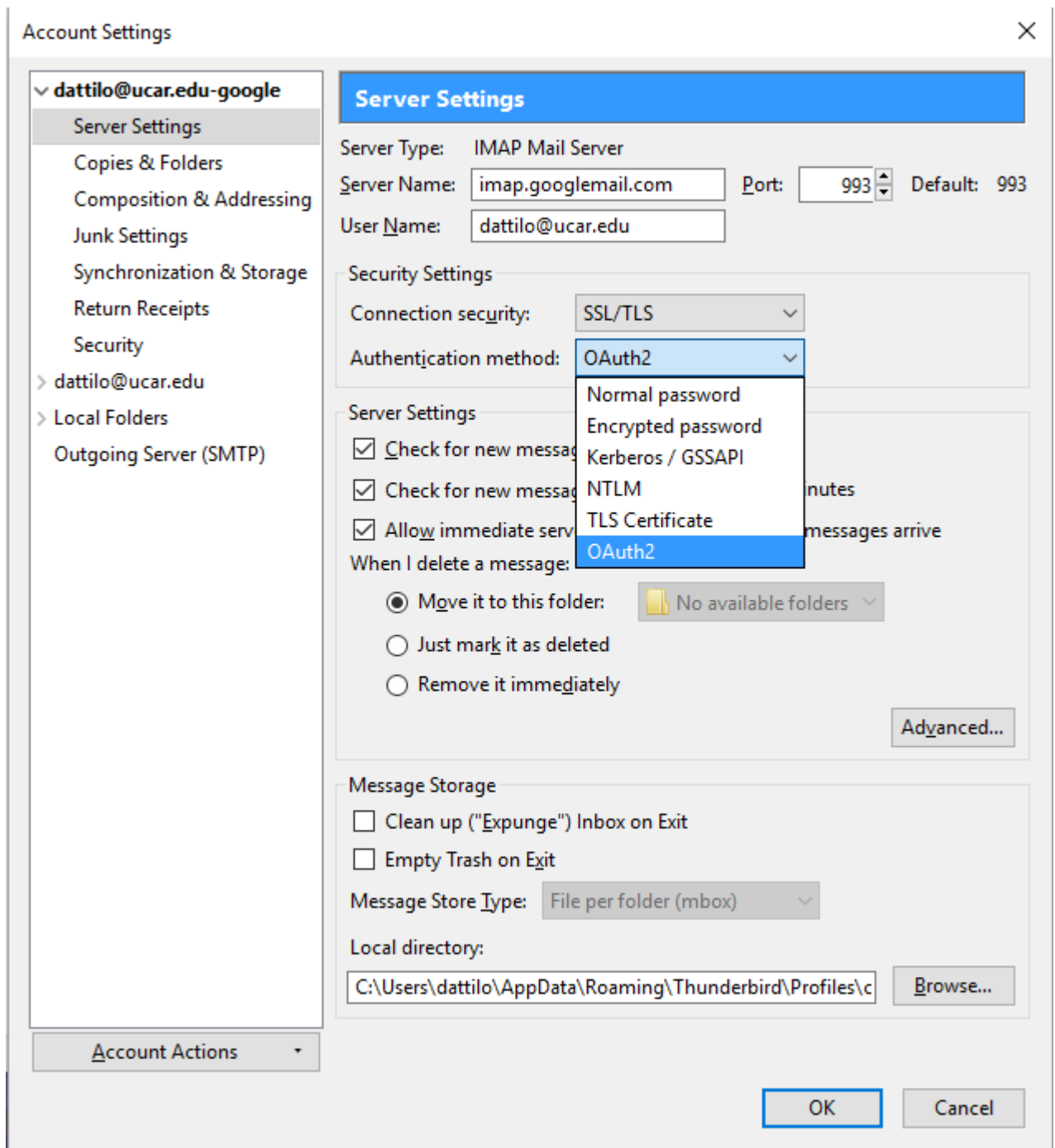
1. Open up Thunderbird and navigate to Tools->Account Settings
In the “classic” interface:



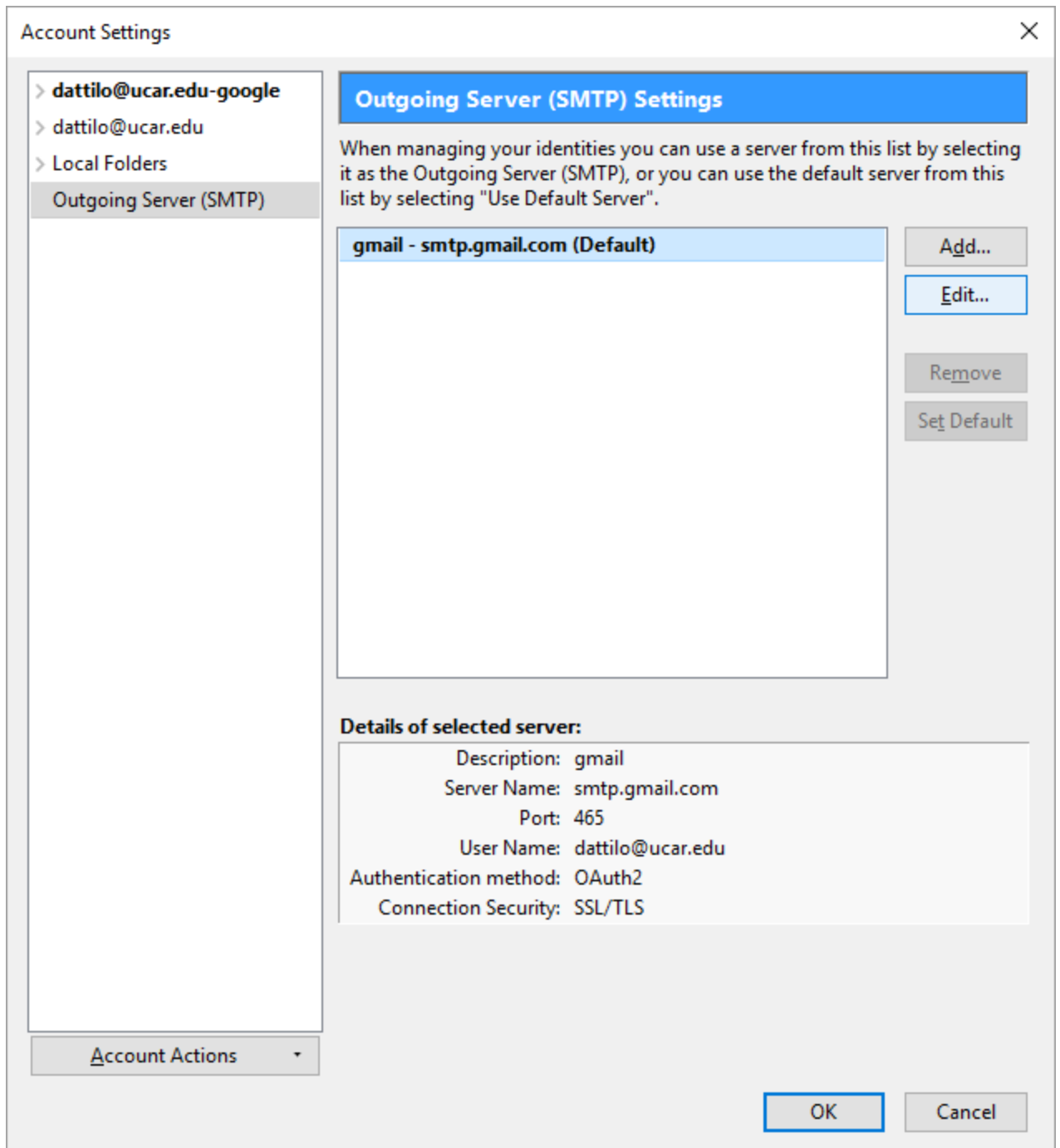
In the “new” interface, you can find it as follows:



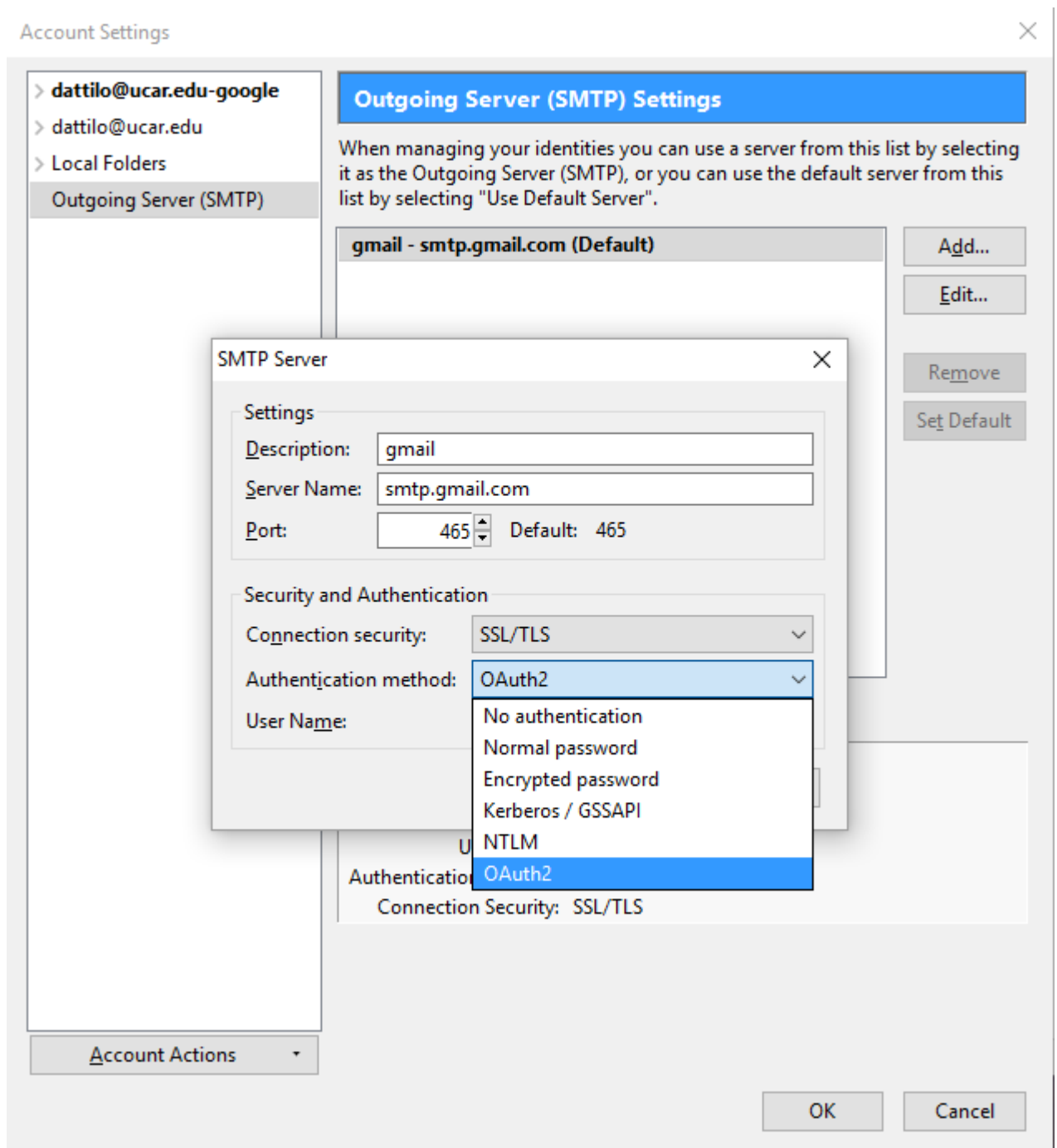
2. Select “Server Settings” from the the left hand pane and then change the “Authentication method” to “OAuth2”:



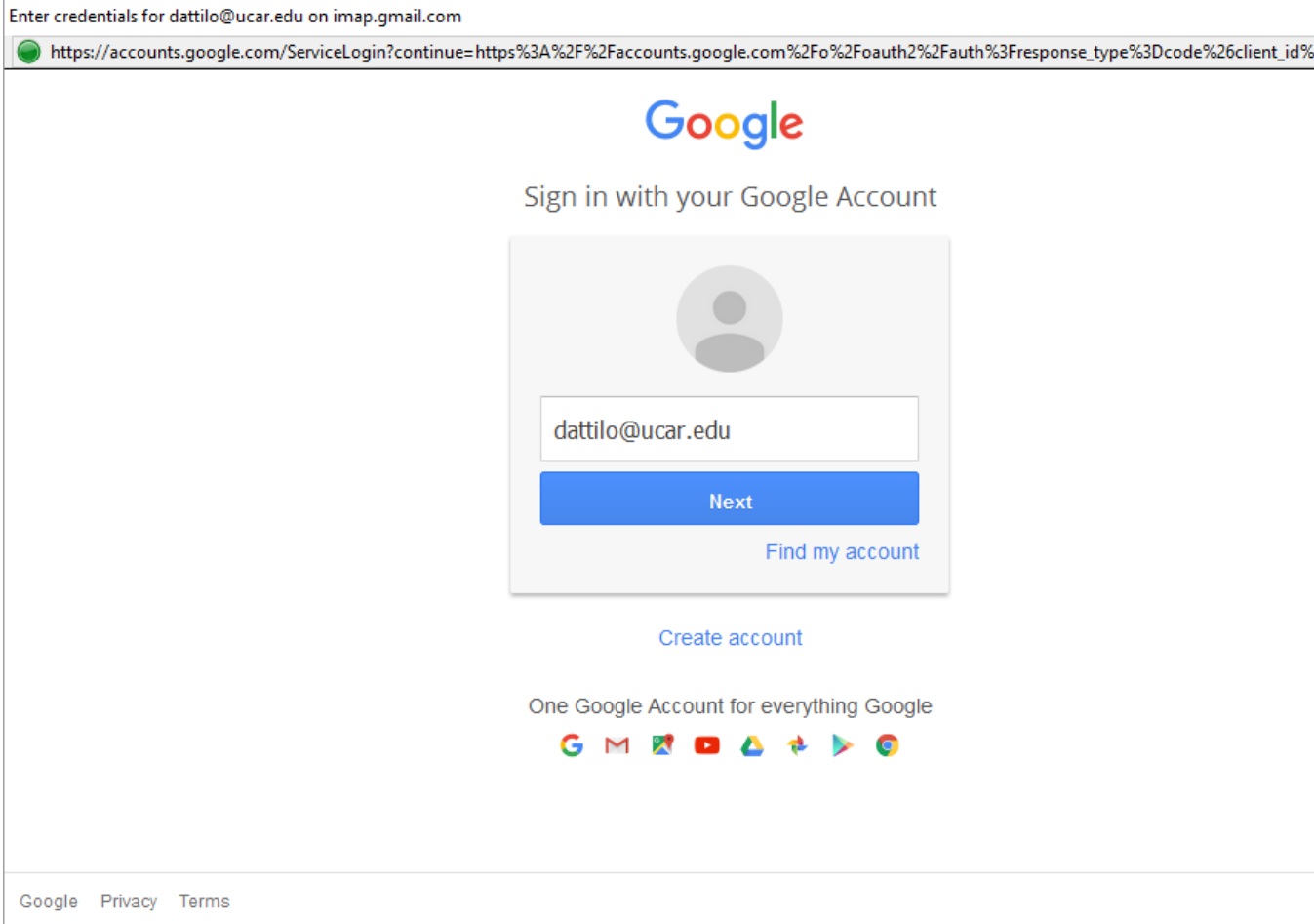
3. Click "OK" and then select "Outgoing Server (SMTP)" and "Edit" the Gmail entry:



4. Once again, change the "Authentication method" to "OAuth2":




5. Click “OK” and then “OK” again to close all windows. Then, restart Thunderbird.
6. You should be prompted to log into Gmail




7. After authenticating, “Allow” Thunderbird to “Read, send, delete and manage your email”:
